Featured Database of the Month ArtStor



ArtStor and JStor are part of the same company, ITHAKA. Your CCC Libraries subscribe to both databases. ITHAKA announced a couple weeks ago that the Artstor Digital Library has more than 1 million images now publicly available at library.artstor.org. Searches in JStor will return hits in ArtStor when searching on a CCC campus or after logging into the library system. Since the images have both historical and artistic value and they can be used in a wide variety of humanities and other Gen Ed classes and to illustrate class papers. These image collections are shared by institutions who make their content available via JSTOR Forum. Those institutions catalog, manage, and share the digital media collections. ArtStor has many features designed to help you in the classroom including: resize and compare up to ten images at a time, create image groups and share them with others at your institution, write group descriptions, and build presentations. You may also download or print images, examine detailed metadata data, and create citations. Images may be downloaded and used in PowerPoint presentations, Word documents and other text and picture documents.
