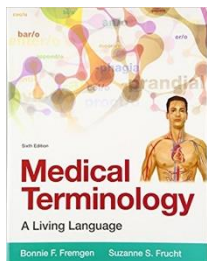


News You Can Use For September 2018

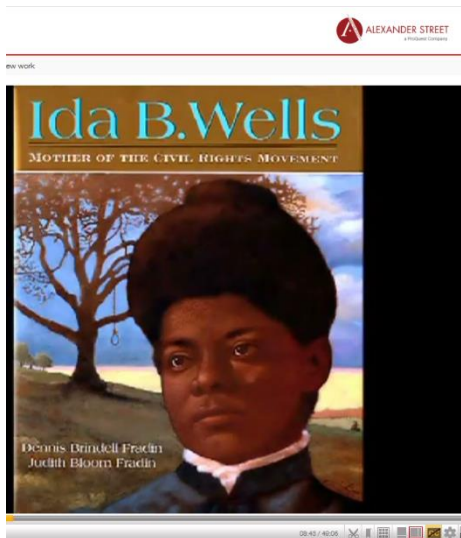
The Library staff has been working very hard making sure that class reserve books are available to students. Many books have similar titles. For example, we have six titles for microbiology. When titles are similar, we ask students to tell us the author. Asking for the “4th edition” does not help us find the book. Remind students that class reserve books are a shared resource that must be used carefully so that the next student can use it. If pages are damaged or books are missing, the next student will not have them.

Featured Database of the Month



Alexander Street Press is a database with many collections of videos. The ones available to CCC users include: American History, Black Studies, Criminal Justice and Public Safety, Health and Society, Nursing Education, Women and Social Movements in the United States, 1600-2000, and World History. The videos include documentaries, instructional video, newsreels, interviews and historical videos. They may be used in class, groups, or by individuals. For most videos, the viewer also has a running

script with the narration. Here are some of the search limitations that you can use: historical event, subject, narrator, date, place, personal names, publisher, and language. For example if you search “Chicago” the results include every Universal newsreel that mentions Chicago.
