



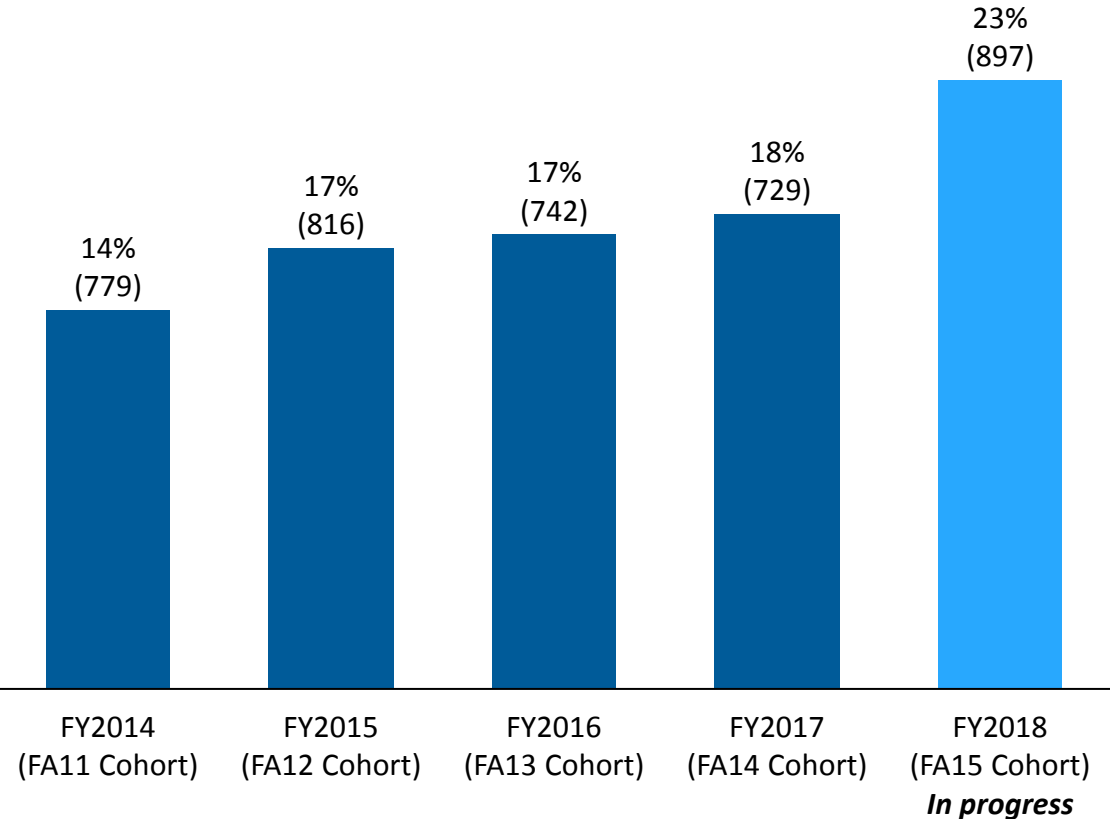

FY2018 Completion Update

Preliminary

CCC's FY18 IPEDS 150 grad rate is at a record high with one term remaining in the tracking period

FY2014 – FY2018 CCC IPEDS 150 Graduation Rates

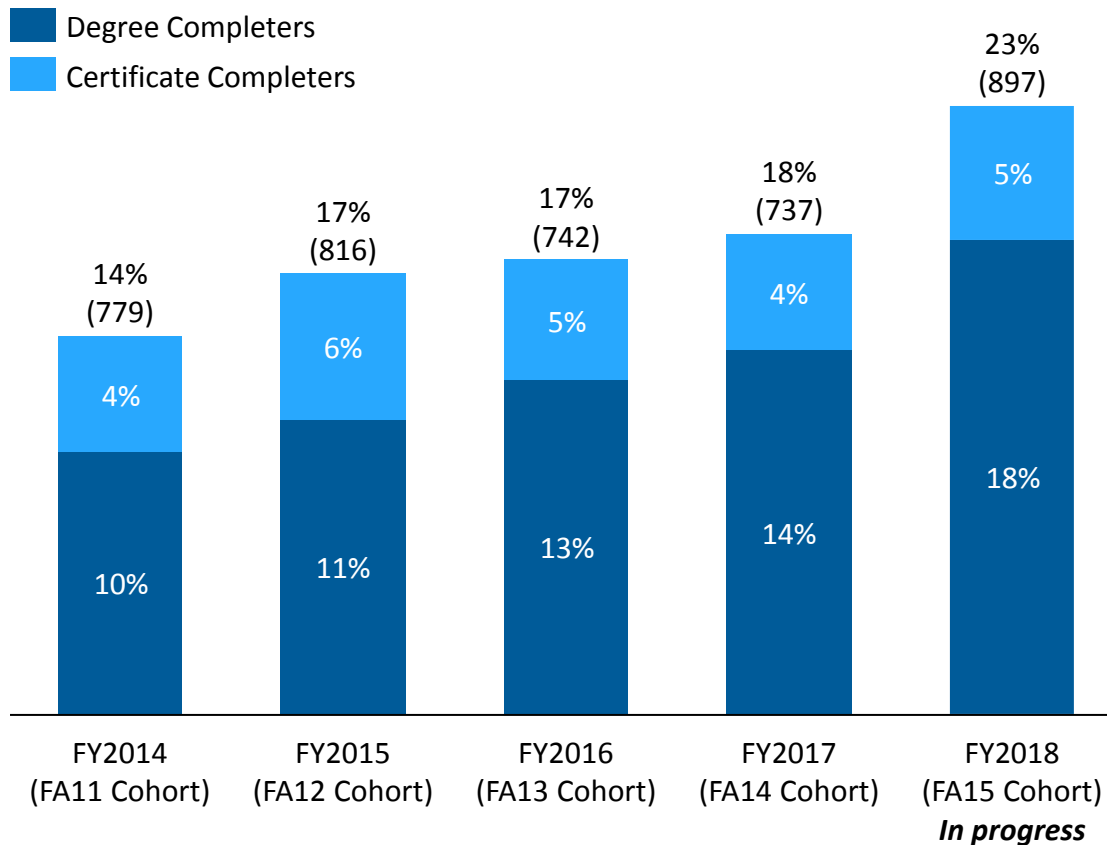


Notes

- At the end of Spring, CCC's graduation rate is 23%.
- There are currently more than 50 students enrolled in Summer projected to complete their degree, so we anticipate the grad rate will increase slightly.

Degree completers make up the majority of completers in the IPEDS cohort

FY2014 – FY2018 CCC IPEDS 150 Graduation Rates by Highest Award

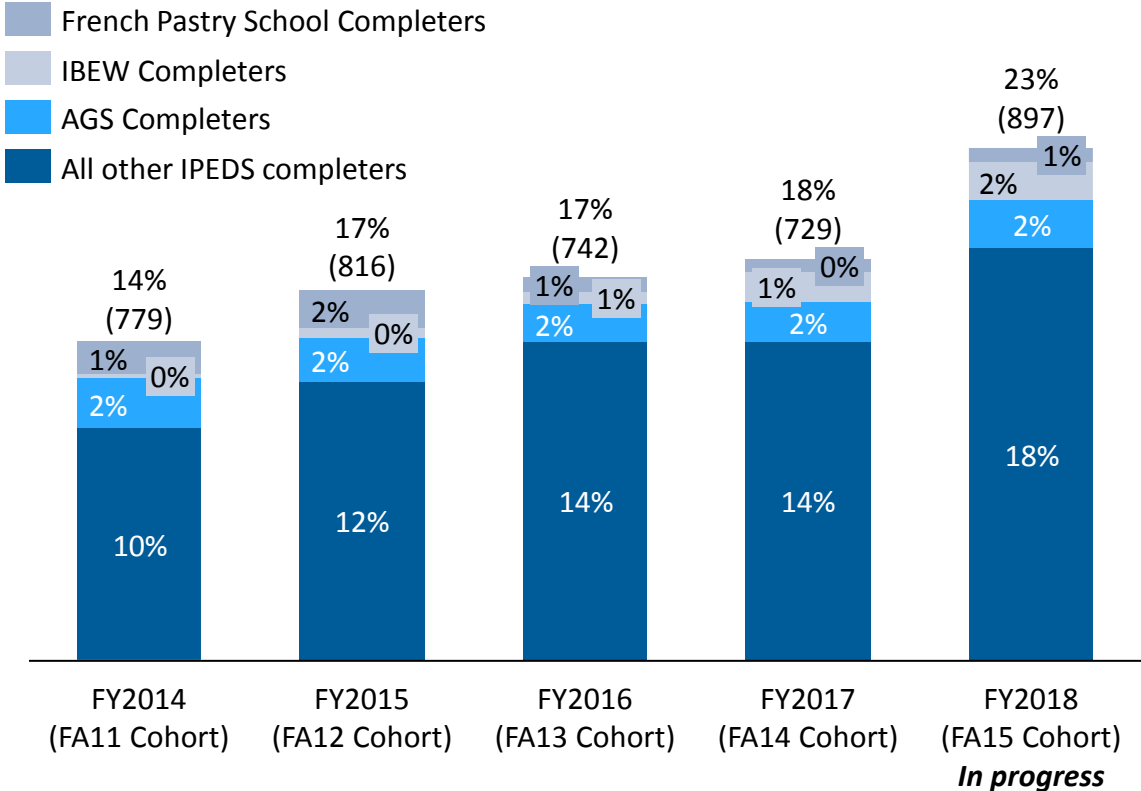


Notes

- Degree completions have been growing steadily since 2014
- Certificate completions have remained constant
- Degree Completions now account for over three-quarters of the graduation rate, its highest proportion on record.

The share of awards from AGS, IBEW, and FPS completers is similar to previous years

FY2014 – FY2018 CCC IPEDS 150 Graduation Rates



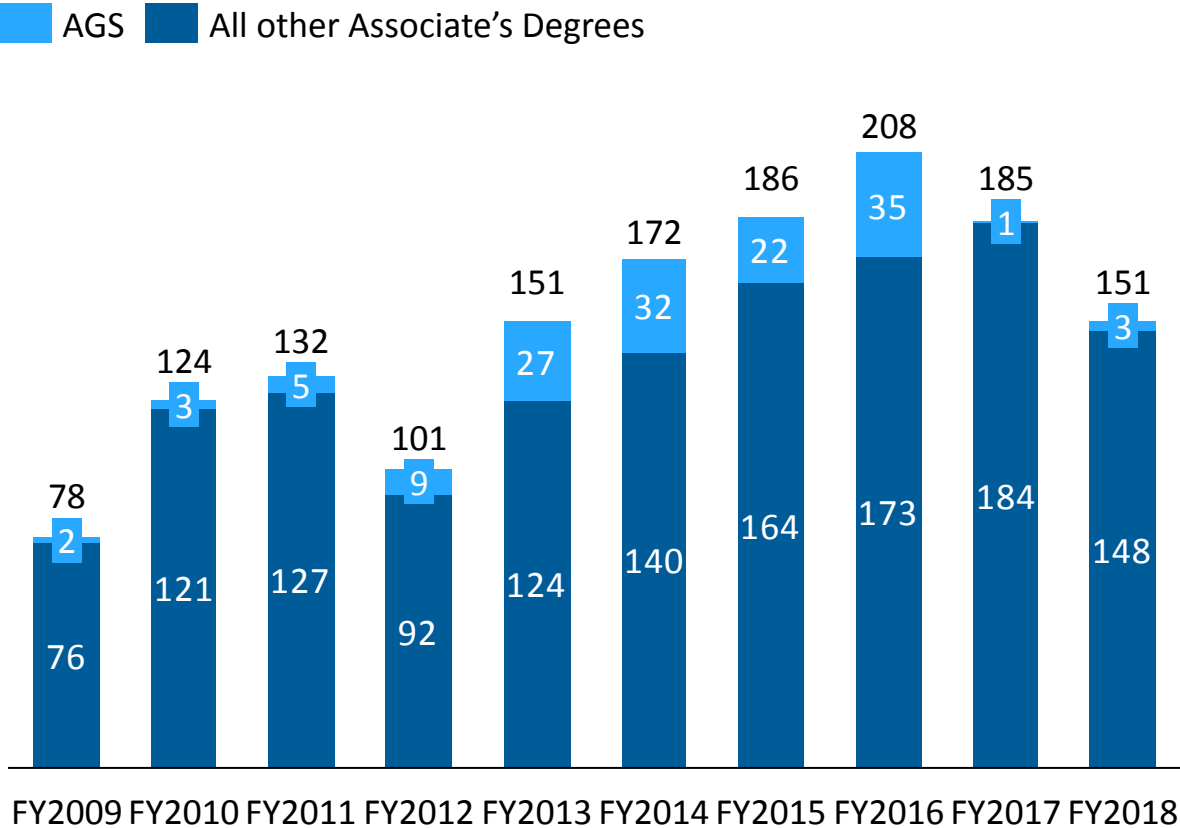
Notes

- AGS, IBEW, and FPS programs are ICCB and HLC approved credentials that students have earned.
- These programs have remained relatively steady in their graduation rate, and are a decreasing proportion of the overall rate.

Notes: AGS completers are not counted if they earned a certificate prior to the AGS. Retroactive degrees have been excluded, and did not meaningfully impact IPEDS grad rates.

Current policy prohibits students from earning an AGS after a higher degree; even before this policy, it was rare

FY2009 – FY2018: Multiple Degree Earners by Degree Type



Notes

- Our policy allows an AAS to be earned before or after an AGS.
- In cases where a student earned an AGS after completing a higher degree, these degrees were awarded before City Colleges had an explicit policy outlining this practice.
- The AAS is career-specific. If/when a student chooses to switch careers, we would expect them to earn an additional degree.
