#### **Revised G-SLOs**

#### Dr. Carlson

- -Discussed each of the six proposed G-SLOs in detail, outlining the requisites required to fulfill each G-SLO.
- -Discussion held about proposed *Communication* G-SLO regarding whether or not students could "use it in the real world?".
- -Discussion held about proposed *Technology and Information Literacy* G-SLO on the differences between information literacy and technology fluency. Amelia Zimet proposed removing information literacy from proposed G-SLO.
- -Proposed G-SLO amended to no longer include information literacy, which will look to be possibly included in each G-SLO.
- -Discussion held about proposed *Problem Solving G-SLO* on what the results KK is attempting to achieve, how will they be measured, and if instructors will have access to the rubrics.
- -Discussion held about proposed *Global Citizenship* about students that may not want to understand the issues addressed by this G-SLO.
- -Vote held to either confirm or reject changes to proposed G-SLOs, with the majority voting in favor.
- -Vote held to determine whether or not to change G-SLO (General Student Learning Outcomes) to ILO (Institutional Learning Outcomes) with the majority voting in favor.
