1. Call to order
2. Approval of Minutes from [January 30, 2025](#) Madi moved to approve, Diego seconded. Motion carried.
3. Dean Ceaser - District-Wide Assessment Updates. District called a meeting for district wide assessment, but did not invite any faculty members. She will provide an update when she attends the next meeting.
4. Chair's Updates -
 - A. Final Reports have been presented to the Administration and the Chairs. Jen has not received any feedback from the administration. **Katie sent out the links to the reports on 2/13 so that committee members can share with their departments.**
 - B. Jen informed the Chairs about the Curriculum Mapping Project. She asked that all Chairs look for any mapping work that was completed over the past 10 years. Jen is meeting with each department to discuss the maps.
 - C. Success Project update. Truman administration tells us that they are already working on this. The Truman project will include developmental education, as well as the development of a data governance committee. Ana volunteered to be

on the committee. Andrew Kerr from faculty council asked for volunteers. Jen related an issue that happened in Child Development. Courses had to go through the PACC process. As a result, the online course shells needed to be updated. One of the matrices the district is using to choose the faculty to work on this project is the Success Data.

5. Department/Unit Level Assessment Updates/Report

A. Mathematics – Peter Rowell. 4 phase study has been going on for quite some time. It didn't work. The way that data was collected didn't work. The new plan is to create a survey. The first plan was quantitative, the second plan is qualitative. They have given the survey over two semesters and now have 140 responses. Responses have not been coded yet. Peter will talk with the department about how they might go about coding the qualitative responses. Ritch comments that students may watch videos that are not the ones that he would choose but still end up with good products. Would it make sense to have a list of faculty approved YouTube creators/channels? Are we in denial as educators about AI? Should we change our mentality? Everything we do is being challenged.

B. Humanities – Ritch Keitel. Humanities had a meeting recently. Hard to get participation. They are looking at collecting assignments or projects that have a theme of response and reflection. For example, Ritch asked students to pick their own piece of music and then apply the ideas that have been discussed in class. Jen asks, could all students use the same piece of music?
