May 2016 Meeting Summary: approved.

- 1) IGNITE #9 Diego Exploring Assessment Options for "Critical Thinking" and "Inquiry & Analysis"
 - --Starting earlier this year to get ahead
 - --Diego presented on assessing 2 outcomes in one year: critical thinking and inquiry & analysis and options to assess these areas: 1) standardized(costly per student), 2) task-based focus groups/CLA+ (time, cost), 3) discipline specific assignment, shared rubric—sample given as handout--(has to be developed in-house))
 - --Discussion:
 - O How much \$ is available to implement this?
 - O Using external instruments is not consistent with what we have already done;
 - O We've done a good job of creating our own in-house rubrics; we would need to update what we have for this next outcome(s)
 - O Faculty involved during last round of assessing CT and IA shared some historical context but noted that the design of the study should look different this time around; not as many institutional resources as now
 - O Can CLA+ be replicated (copyright issues)?
 - O Rubric should be provided to instructors in advance
 - O Can a rubric incorporate both outcomes?
 - O Which comes first—critical thinking vs inquiry and analysis?
 - O Possibly open sources might have something for us to borrow
 - O Who would participate—what will the sample be? Would faculty want to use class time for this?
 - O See where the commonalities are across the disciplines in what CT is, create rubric based off of this to use across the board, implement in classes
 - O For Oct. meeting: brainstorm questions to pose to Dept about CT and IA

 - --Video: embed in BB and use as a primer for faculty/students before giving a oral presentation; to be used across all disciplines to create uniform expectations on oral presentations
 - --Franklin will call for committee volunteers as needed (Geoff, Ana)
