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• 1) Quick Business:

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• 2) GenEd Study: Critical Thinking and Inquiry & Analysis

- Data: Maureen explained overview of data sheet
- --Looking at where/when people thought items were N/A
- --Mean=2, meets expectations; lower than 2, not meeting expectations
- --CT #5—Synthesizing knowledge tended to be lower, but it was noted that this is higher level of thinking—grad-level
- --It was noted that there are certain criteria which as 1^{st} and 2^{nd} year college courses we do not expect our students to do
- --Example: IA # 5—eliminate 'design' or change language so it more accurately and appropriately captures what we do in our courses, eliminate #5 (or #1) completely or combine #5 and #1.
 - --Request feedback from departments on modifying criteria and language; follow-up in Nov meeting
- --Maureen is working on Interrater reliability issue
- o Quantitative: Overview of scores; early impressions
- Qualitative: Subcommittee to identify themes and patterns
 - --Adrienne Driver to lead subcommittee
- Next Study: Quantitative Skills
- Begin thinking of cross-college assessment ideas

- o Return to college-wide collection and discussion (rather than dept.-based, like I&A and CT study)
- --Discussion of how to execute this next study: pros and cons to both formats
- --We need to think about which artifacts (in each discipline) would represent a student's ability in this area to assess
 - --What will be the outcomes for this skill area?
 - --Request for math dept to present on uncovering quantitative reasoning in other disciplines
