Truman Advising Mission: Truman College Advising intentionally serves, collaborates, and connects with students, faculty and other departments to promote academic success and personal growth.

What is Academic Advising? Academic advising is a collaborative process between students and specialists who seek to understand academic engagement, use professional knowledge for productive interactions, and empower campus and community members to successfully navigate and persist in academic endeavors and achieve academic goals (Larson, Aiken-Wisniewski & Barkemeyer, 2018)*.

Scheduling an Appointment: Each Truman credit student is assigned a College Advisor for unlimited free advising appointments that will administered via zoom either on campus or remotely. To schedule an appointment, log into my.ccc.edu and use "Navigate" > "Advising" > Select a reason AND "In-person" or "remote". You will get zoom access information sent from your advisor via email. Appointments are typically 45 minutes, except during peak periods in January and August when all students are seen on a walk-in basis. You may also schedule an appointment by visiting the Drop-In link below.

- Schedule and attend at least one Advising appointment each semester while at City Colleges of Chicago
- Arrive prepared and on time for appointments with a willingness to learn and grow
- Read emails sent to CCC student email account
- Accept personal responsibility for decisions
- Become familiar with campus programs, policies, and procedures by using resources (my.ccc.edu, website, <u>Student Handbook</u>) to seek answers to questions
