Intro:

Carrie called this meeting to order at 3:03pm. Updates & main agenda:

Carrie asked everyone to review the charge – especially those playing a formal or ad hoc role. The charge is revised annually in the spring.

Exercise: Carrie asked everyone to write down one thing related to assessment that you're confident about, and one thing you're unclear or less than confident about. We turned our anonymous responses in to Carrie.

This semester at beginning of meetings spend 10 minutes talking about assessment. It's a whole discipline involving a new language, and can be complicated. Taking time to really learn about it can be valuable.

Review assessment planning calendar. Thinking ahead to assessment times, direction on how to approach from Carrie.

Presentation: Carrie walked through a Prezi that she created entitled "What is Assessment". The shortcut to this presentation is: goo.gl/zdAq20

HLC visit: Carrie encouraged us to think about whether any of us would like to take on a role in the HLC accreditation process.

Subcommittees: We discussed organizing the committee subcommittees differently this year. Carrie dubbed the idea "Subs 2.0". The subcommittees would be based on different editors. Depending on the work at hand, the committee would break into teams of editors for content, editors for formatting, editors for grammar and editors for writing style.

Department chairs meeting: Carrie attended the department chairs meeting and provided an update on the humanities assessment that was piloted in the summer. She informed them that program-level assessment is happening, people shouldn't be surprised.

District-wide assessment meeting: Carrie also attended the District-wide assessment meeting. Keith interested in having a faculty survey across all City Colleges aimed at finding out about the climate of assessment. There was some discussion on this topic including the question of what the "climate of assessment" meant.

CCC Web site: Content editors of pages on the CCC Web site have been asked to review pages. This includes Carrie.

Updates from Jen: Jen attended meetings about the open bid for a new LMS or Learning Management System (i.e. we currently use Blackboard). Jen created a spreadsheet including details on what an ideal LMS would be capable of. Jen then met with Keith about these concerns. Hopefully this will result in purchasing the assessment piece of either Blackboard or of a new system. Jen is planning to meet with Vince Wiggins about how people are learning in an online environment.

It is an ongoing process which involves self-reflection. Building a culture of assessment involves agreeing on a basic definition at an institutional level.

Unit assessment: Erica. We have 10 separate unit-level liaisons representing academic departments including the library. Thanks to administrative support.

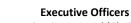
Subcommittees:

Some discussion points included the order of the various sections, the question of whether we should use a Google Form or the Web-based SurveyMonkey application, the similarity to the 2007 humanities assessment, and whether we should have a computer lab option (in which an area of computers with a volunteer proctor should be made available).

Carrie would like to look into whether funds can be had in order to run the survey using SurveyMonkey.

Humanities assessment:

The committee spent much of the meeting time looking at the Humanities Assessment. The number of essays was reduced from four to one in contrast to the 2007 Humanities Assessment. And with the current Humanities Assessment, a concerted effort was made to choose topic items of equal obscurity. We discussed how graders will be chosen. For the 2007 Humanities Assessment graders were chosen from different departments, not exclusively the Humanities Department, but where those from outside of humanities had some aptitude for the subject matter. We will use Google Docs as planned as the platform for carrying out the assessment.

General Education updates

Carrie, in meeting with Armen, requested the purchase of the second edition of Linda Suskie book, Assessing Student Learning a Common Sense Guide for officers and liaisons. This will cost less but still come with the provision that members from all, or virtually all, academic departments of the College can read the book.

In the spring the committee might publish a special edition newsletter in which we explore examples of how and to what extent our assessment findings in various areas have been taken into account and/or implemented in some way by the administration.

Intro, Apologies, and Previous Minutes:

Carrie called this meeting to order at 3:03 pm.

Apologies for absence:

Margarita Chavez sent her apologies for having to be absent for this meeting.

Review of 10/05 minutes:

Jen motioned to approve the minutes of the 10/05 meeting, and that was seconded by Cindy.

Findings from the Natural Science assessment:

Philip Vargas and Sarah Kakumanu presented to the Assessment Committee on their findings and recommendations from the Natural Sciences Assessment carried out in fall of 2015. Phil provided the Committee with a beautifully formatted, preliminary paper entitled Student Learning in the Natural Sciences: a Correlation Assessment. Among other findings, there was a demonstrated correlation between taking courses in the natural sciences and relatively high performance on the assessment tool.

Some questions posed by the committee included the following. What is the correlation between relative success on the assessment tool and courses taken in the discipline? Students who took courses in four disciplines – Chemistry, Biology, Physics and Inter-disciplinary 299 (STEM Scholar program) – performed relatively well according to statistical analysis.

It was suggested in the discussion that it would be interesting if it were possible to isolate four distinct groupings of students in order to see how they would excel on the assessment – students who haven't taken any sciences courses, students who have had general education physical science, students who have taken general education biological science, and students who have taken both general education courses in physical and biological sciences.

Attitudinal questions arose in the discussion and were addressed in the paper. From the committee, one member wondered whether a desire to take a course in one of the natural sciences disciplines in the first place would tend to indicate a desire to excel in that discipline. Is this a valid assumption and how can it be answered by the assessment?

Carrie suggested running the Natural Sciences Assessment again in the near future. It is all set up and wouldn't be difficult to run again.

Armen suggested running it as a District-wide assessment, assuming the learning outcomes are all the same. It was agreed that there would be lots of variables to sort out in such an endeavor, but that it's something to think about down the road.

On Tuesday, October 18th, Phillip, Sarah, and Carrie will give a presentation on the Natural Sciences Assessment at the Assessment Institute held at Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis.

Humanities Assessment:

Carrie suggested that the members of the assessment committee each take the humanities assessment. She suggested that we take it anonymously but to indicate that we are taking it as an AC member.

Intro, Apologies, and Previous Minutes:

Carrie called this meeting to order at 3:05pm.

Apologies for absence:

Phil Vargas sent his apologies for not being able to attend today, and Vince Wiggins did as well.

Review of 10/12 minutes:

Loretta motioned to approve these minutes. This was seconded by Jen.

General discussion on assessment tool design:

Unit-level liaison for the Library, Todd Heldt, asked for feedback from the committee as to whether he should add a dummy question to his assessment tool in order to filter out people who don't take questions seriously. Bral suggested it might be enough just to look at the overall consistency of the answers. Jen suggested structuring questions in such a way as to make it obvious when survey takers are going through the motions. Jeff asked if a dummy question, such as "answer C if you are a human", be added to the humanities assessment. Generally, committee members suggest not putting a dummy question at the end, rather it might be placed approximately two/thirds of the way through the survey. Jen suggests such a question should be something the assessment taker would have to fill in, rather than choose a number, or check a box. Jen also suggested that if student ID numbers are being collected, that could constitute the so-called dummy question, placed not at the very beginning but somewhere in the middle of the survey.

Report on presentation and attendance at the IUPUI Assessment Institute:

Carrie and Sarah reported on presenting and attendance at the IUPUI Assessment Institute. Sarah commented on the observation that most of the sessions that she attended dealt in some way with rubrics. The opening speaker talked about times when he/she worked under less than stellar support for assessment, and Sarah commented that she felt grateful for the high level of support that we have here.

Paul suggested that we might write a general piece for the fall newsletter involving a conversation about assessment on a more conversational level than some of the more detail-oriented or academic pieces that we would typically write for the Assessment Times.

Carrie presented some of the comments made by keynote speaker, Sylvia Jenkins, President of Moraine Valley Community College, along with comments made by Tom Angelo, and Linda Suskie. These were presented in a separate document on the Assessment Institute. Linda Suskie for instance has done a lot of work on rubrics and Carrie said that she would like the committee to return to the topic of rubrics in the short term.

Erica said that a rubric tied to assignment design is likely to be the most compelling to our faculty. Amy suggested employing a "backward design" approach to working with rubrics. Carrie commented that students at the graduate level tend to be highly dependent on rubrics. Jen said that evidence suggests that rubrics should be shown to students up front, not only after the fact. Carrie emphasized that we have established a seat at the table at the annual IUPUI Assessment Institute.

Carrie brought back from the conference a small selection of books on assessment that she passed around the conference table for assessment committee members to look at.

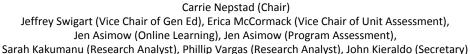

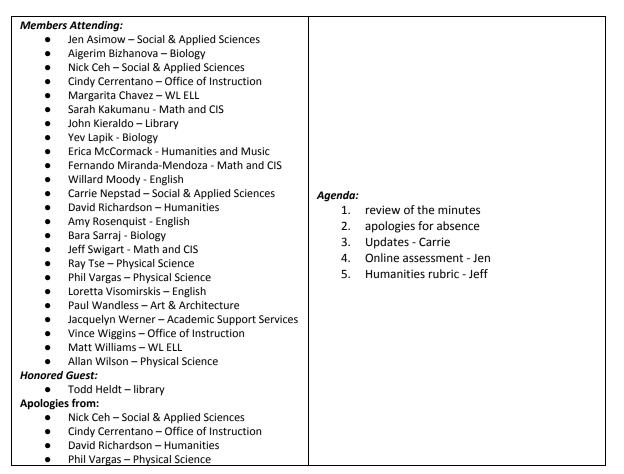

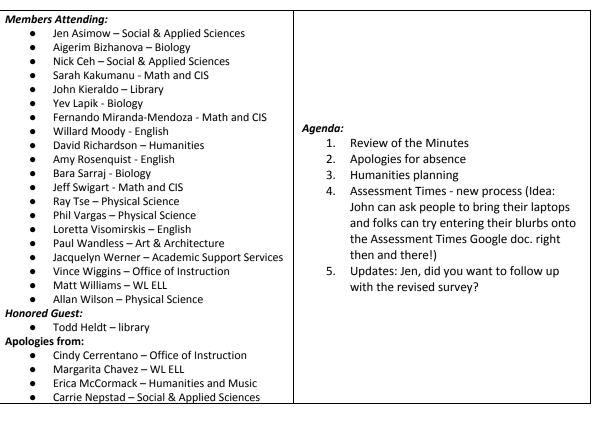

Intro, Apologies, and Previous Minutes:

Jen called this meeting to order at 3:08pm.

Apologies for absence:

Cindy Cerrentano, Margarita Chavez, Erica McCormack, and Carrie Nepstad sent their apologies for not being able to attend today.

Review of 10/26 minutes:

Ray moved to approve the minutes from last week and this motion was seconded by Loretta.

Online learning survey and letter continued from last week:

Carrie is preparing a letter to be sent to all online teaching faculty which will describe what assessment is all about. Another letter, this one written by Jen, will follow Carrie's letter. Jen provided a revised copy of this letter. It will follow Carrie's by about a week, and it will be sent to online teaching faculty in which they will be encouraged to participate in a survey of students' perceptions of learning in

online courses.

Jen also shared a printout of some nine pages in length of the Google Form survey that this letter will encourage the students to take. This survey constitutes an indirect assessment of student learning, i.e. it involves students' perspectives on the overall learning environment. One optional answer to a question in the survey had language modified from "personal learning style" to "personal communication style. In another question the committee opted for the language "I am a self-directed learner", and, "I prefer learning in private", among other alternatives. Finally, Jen also split one formerly extensive question into two, one dealing with interactive elements, and another dealing with instructional elements.

The committee took a short time from the scheduled agenda to review the distinction between a direct assessment and an indirect assessment. A direct assessment is essentially about finding out what students are learning, whereas an indirect assessment is about how they perceive the learning environment that they are working in.

The survey takes the approach of relating the online environment to the traditional environment. Vince points out that this survey is going out District-wide.

Humanities planning:

The committee looked again at the rubric for guiding the graders of the forthcoming humanities assessment. Erica and Dave have had a lot of discussions about the rubric over the past week or so. The committee spend a short amount of time reviewing the experience of those who graded the previous humanities assessment. The committee spent time looking at the poem By the Stream, but Lawrence Dunbar and an anonymous student's response to it from a pilot of the assessment. The committee discussed in some detail what would constitute a relatively strong response to this poem versus a relatively weak response to this poem, i.e. strong evidence of the outcome, adequate evidence of the outcome, emerging evidence of the outcome, or little or no evidence of the outcome.

Assessment Times planning:

The meeting adjourned just after 4pm and there was not enough time for discussion of the forthcoming Assessment Times newsletter. However, in during the week reminders will be sent to committee members about when to send their draft articles, and whom to send them to.

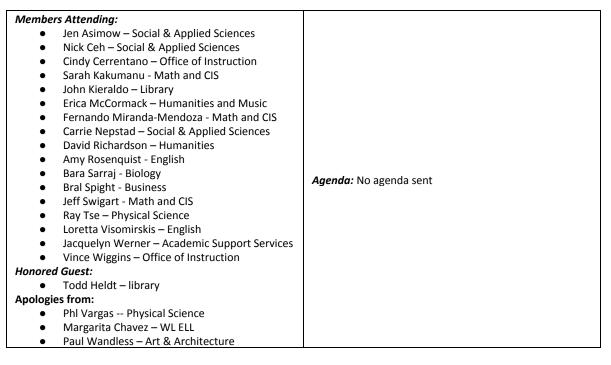

Brief updates

Updates on meetings we've had, and going to have. Updates on planning for the norming session.

Carrie met with Armen yesterday. She updated Armen on the progress on the assessment times. Carrie spent the morning reading through the current draft. Carrie has been working on the special assignment forms for days. Has become responsibility of chair, instead of secretary. I.e. not fair for departmental secretary of social and applied sciences.
