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Good Assessment Informs Good Teaching Practice

My name is Ivanhoe Tejeda and I work with Jen in the Applied Science Department. We are office "buddies" and when our schedules permit, we sit and talk about our college and our students. One thing led to another and here I am, a faculty member from the outside looking into the world of the assessment committee at HWC. I would like to thank Jen for providing me with the opportunity to address my views regarding assessment in this newsletter.

This is what I initially see regarding the committee's work this semester. Our office has been consumed with "assessment calendars", "assessment surveys" and "assessment literature". Lately I'm still finding sharpened and unsharpened "assessment pencils" from the packages that were distributed a few weeks ago.

This is how the committee's work has affected me up to this point. Our college has been awakened from a state of conformity and is now addressing issues that would otherwise be overlooked in our busy schedules. As defined by Lorin Anderson in <u>Classroom Assessment</u>, assessment is "the process of gathering and interpreting information to aid in classroom decision making".
