



#### An HWC definition

• "Human Diversity" describes variations within the full range of cognitive, behavioral and psychosocial practices through which human beings share life in common spaces. Experiences of diversity include race, ethnicity, gender, religion, socioeconomic status, sexual orientation, physical attributes and disabilities, age, health, language, education, political beliefs and other differences in cultural expression and tradition.

#### Human Diversity Objectives

- Facilitate the development of a broad perspective of diversity
- Foster responsible citizenship as a member of a diverse world
- Encourage the understanding of commonality and differences
- Provide direct and indirect experiences with various cultures.

#### **Student Learning Outcomes**

- Analyze & discuss contemporary multicultural, global, & international questions in a diverse setting
- Identify & respect that there are various ways of thinking, communicating, & interacting, for example, by working with culturally diverse groups towards a larger goal

#### SLOs cont.

- Evaluate diverse moral & intellectual perspectives, principles, systems, and structures.
- Articulate the value of cross cultural campus & community activities and their impact on the lives of others
